Sidney (Sid) E. Thompson , age 79 of Apple Valley, CA passed away peacefully on September 3, 2024 at his home in Apple Valley after an extended illness. A small service and burial will be held at a later date in Grand Rapids.

Mr. Thompson was born on July 31, 1945, the son of the late Edina and Stanley Thompson in Grand Rapids, MN. He was a veteran of the US Airforce, serving three tours in Vietnam and later in the National Guard. Sid married the love of his life, Sharon Domiano in 1970 and became a dad to her 4 children. After Sid returned from Vietnam, he went to work for 14 years at US Steel, Minntac in Mount Iron, MN and then was transferred to Lander, WY where he worked for another 18 months until US Steel sold their operations in Wyoming. Sid and Sharon then decided to move to California to work with his friend, Bill Zaiser in the telephone industry, which he did for a year until he was hired by Pfizer mining where he retired after 30 years.

Sid was a hard worker and took pride in all that he did. He was also a man of very few words. His most rewarding job and joy however was loving, supporting and caring for the love of his life, his wife, Sharon for 54 years. Sid leaves behind his beloved wife, Sharon and her three girls, Lorrie Hendricks, Wendy Perez, and Tammy Saylor and his grandchildren, Travis, Rick, Nick, Jessica, Joshua and Justin as well as great grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his stepson, Steven Cornett, his parents, Edina & Stanley Thompson and his aunt and uncle Olive and Carl Dunkelbarger.
